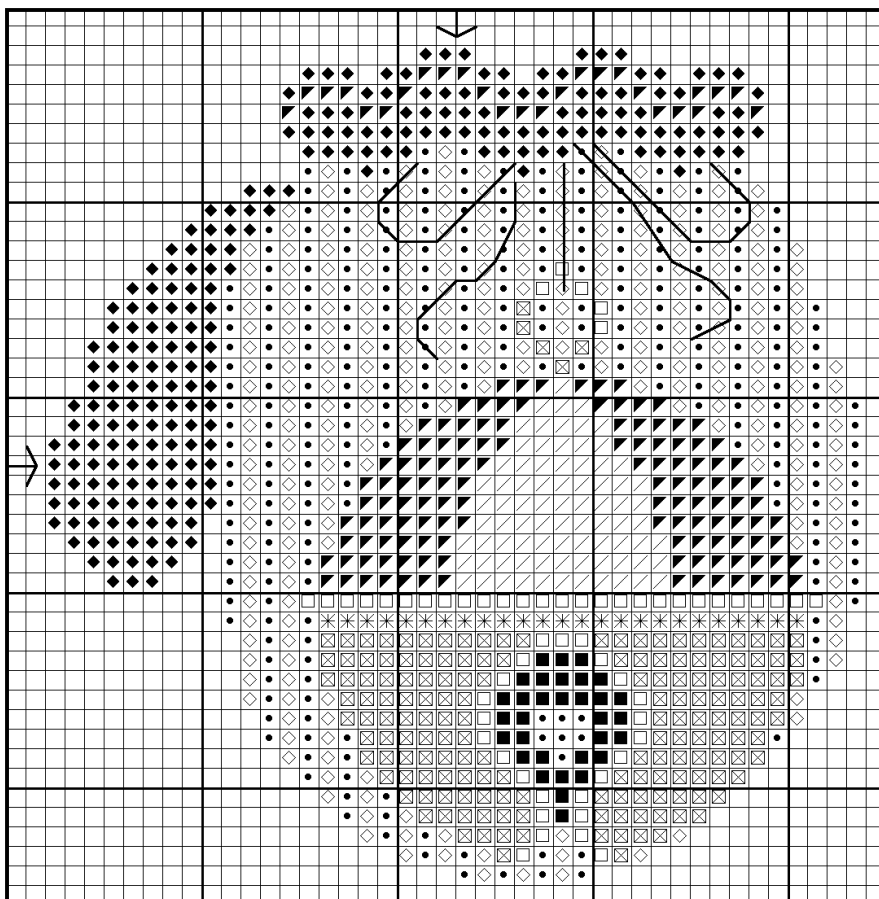

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Jingle Bell Mitten

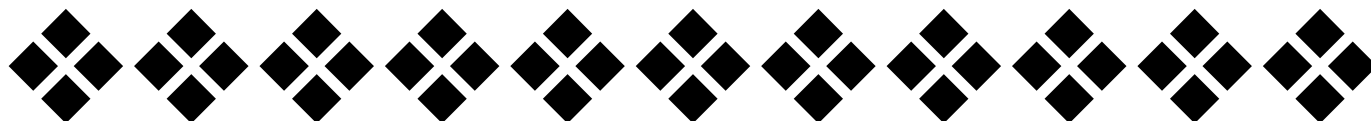
DESIGN AREA **42W X 43H**
 10 count. 4.2 X 4.3
 14 [28 linen] 3 X 3.1
 15 [30 linen] 2.8 X 2.9
 16 [32 linen] 2.6 X 2.7
 Linen worked over two threads.

Backstitch "string" in 2 ply 834/874, single ply on finer weave fabrics.
 *Kreinik metallic braids can very effectively be substituted for the gold-colored cotton floss, as can silks and over-dyes for the other floss colors listed. Substitute #4 Braid 002HL for 831 and 102C for 834 if sparkle is your desire.

SUGGESTIONS When the wind is blowing and you're "dashing through the snow", you NEED a jingle bell mitten. Ours wont keep you warm, but you will have fun stitching it. The ground fabric suggestion is something Christmas tree green in linen or cotton. Pictured here is R&R Reproduction "Bud's Green" over-dyed 10 count Tulla. Work floss in 5 ply for 10 count. Adjust the ply for finer weave fabrics. Please be encouraged to substitute one or many of the wonderful fun threads available in your local needle-work shop for the colors listed. A real jingle bell can be attached at the cuff for "sound effect."
